## INSURANCE PROBE SOON TO BE STARTED

Committee to Investigate Methods  
and Practices of Various Boards

Drafting of the report to be made to the Legislature will be started within a few weeks by the legislative committee in charge of the investigation into the methods and practices of fire insurance boards, combinations and pools, and the reasons why they probably be held here, where ready access can be had to the records of the State Insurance Department.

Chairman Richard J. Baldwin, who was here this week, said that data was being obtained from the department to supplement the information gained by the committee during its numerous sessions, and that he thought everything desired was in sight. While no information is forthcoming about recommendations, it is believed that bills establishing regulations in regard to ratings will be presented and relative to mutual companies be drafted for discussion.
