In a sermon on "The Big Day of the

In a sermon on "The Big Day of the Week" yesterday the Rev. Dr. Clayton A. Smucker, pastor of Stevens Memorial Methodist Church, Thirteenth and Vernon streets, took a crack at Sunday baseball and "social snobbery." He said, in part:
"Sunday is the big day of the week. The week-days are the days of the hand. Sunday is the day of the larger uses. We have no right to prostitute the day. Do the Christian patriotic people of the state of Pennsylvania want it? God forbid.
"The church of to-day is not a refrigerator for preserving perishable piety. It is a dynamo for charging human wills. A church is not a club for social snobs, but a hospital for the healing of broken hearts and a home of refreshment for the weary and troubled souls. The church does not exist to afford amusement, but to offer instruction and inspiration for living a life of godliness. The business of the church is not to furnish hammocks for the lazy. It is rather to offer well-fitting vokes for drawing life's loads. The object of the Church is not to furnish strength and courage to meet and master them."
