Harrisburg and Elmira Clash in the Opening Battle at Island Park

The Cockill crusaders worked their way up from the cellar position. Elmira traveled from seventh place to the top. They finished seventh one year ago. "Wid" Conroy, who is in his first year as a manager, won the pennant for Elmira, after one of the best finishes ever seen in the league.
