PENROSE SPEAKS TO THE FARMERS

Greeted by Thousands of People in the "Enemy's Country" Yesterday Afternoon

Senator Boies Penrose was up in the northern tier, often called "The Enemy's Country," yesterday, while William Flinn, William Draper Lewis and Vance C. McCormick were lambasting him here. While they were talking the Senator was out making votes.

The Senator went through Wyoming, Bradford and Susquehanna counties yesterday and is in Bradford today. He has been cordially greeted everywhere and men who were aligned against Republicans in 1912

are out for the Senator. The Senator ended the day with a night meeting in Troy and he left Tunkhannock early. A crowd assembled at the Graham Hotel and cheered him as he started away in his motor car. His first stop was at Nicholson, where a reception had been arranged for him. It was attended by many of the active Republicans of that section of Wyoming county. For an hour he shook hands with callers, among whom were several farmers who expressed views highly unfavorable to the low tariff policy of the Democratic Administration.

From Nicholson the senior Senator returned to the northern tier, his first stop being at Montrose, Susquehanna county. Outside the town a delegation in automobiles met him and escorted him to the Dallas House. A reception committee of about 100 prominent businessmen and active Republicans awaited him, and the Senator spent an hour handshaking. Later there was an automobile parade to the Montrose fair grounds. There was a large attendance of farmers and their families at the fair, the crowd being one of the most enthusiastic Senator Penrose has addressed during the campaign. On the platform were

many prominent Republicans of Montrose county and others, including J. T. McPadden, of Bradford county, Republican candidate for Congress in this district. The crowd cheered J. T. Davies, of Montrose, when he presented the Senator in an eulogistic speech.

Senator Penrose spoke at length on subjects of interest to the farmers. They followed him closely and cheered when he expressed his views on legislation with which the farmers are directly concerned.

Wm. D. Menear, Dillsburg Banker, Dies This Morning

Dillsburg, Pa., Sept. 17.—William D. Menear, one of Dillsburg's best known residents and businessmen, died last night at his home in North Baltimore street, after an illness of several years. Although Mr. Menear's health was poor, he was in fair condition until several days ago, when he developed pneumonia. He is 68 years old.

Mr. Menear, who was a Civil War veteran, for many years owned and conducted the Hotel Central, in South

Baltimore street, until several years ago, when he sold it to George B. Totton and retired from active business. At the time of his death he was a director of the Dillsburg National Bank, director of the Dillsburg Water Company and a heavy real estate owner. He was a member of the Grand Army of the Republic and Carlisle Lodge of Elks. He is survived by his wife and four daughters, Mrs. Jonathan Fortney, of York; Mrs. Daniel Hamme, of Harrisburg; Miss Sarah Menear and Miss Marietta Menear, teacher of the grammar school, both at home. No funeral arrangements were made this morning.

GETTYSBURG COLLEGE OPENS

Gettysburg, Pa., Sept. 17.—Gettysburg College opened her eighty-second academic year yesterday with very impressive exercises in Brua Chapel. The entire faculty was present in academic dress as Dean Biele and Chaplain Wentz conducted the opening devotional exercises, after which President Granville delivered the address of welcome to old and new students. The largest entering class in the history of the institution (over

100) was there to accept greetings as well as an unusually large number of students from other colleges seeking entrance to the upper classes. The total number of students in the college also breaks all previous records.
