Pupils of the Penn school building, Seventh and Cumberland streets, got together last Spring and decided that they wanted a stereopticon lantern. Assisted by the teachers of the school the boys and girls gave a festival and did other little things to get money with the result that the school now has a fine lantern, and aluminum screen.
