GENERAL DIAZ BURIED
Paris, July 6.—The funeral of General Porfirio Diaz, the former president of Mexico, was held at 10:30 o'clock this morning in the Catholic Church of St. Honore D'Yloyau. The ceremony was largely attended and included the representatives of the government of France and the city of Paris.

AEROPLANE ATTACK FAILS
Berlin, July 6.—A Great Britain aeroplane attack was directed against the German position in a German bay on the North Sea on the morning of July 4, according to a German official statement issued under date of July 5. The attack, the announcement adds, failed.

Governor Brumbaugh at Valley Forge Celebration
Philadelphia, July 6.—More than 2500 persons, including the guests of the Commonwealth from every part of Pennsylvania, gathered at Valley Forge to take part in a great outdoor patriotic and religious celebration of the National Fourth of July. Governor Brumbaugh and members of his staff were present and the Governor made the oration of the day. The exercises were held in the grove facing the Washington Memorial Chapel, from the open-air pulpit of which the Governor addressed the crowd. The guests of the State, to the number of approximately 300, motored to the historic camping grounds from the Hotel Adelphi. After the exercises they were entertained at an informal supper at Fort Mifflin. The pilgrimage to Valley Forge on the part of these guests was part of the three days' celebration of the National Fourth of July planned by the Pennsylvania State Commission and the Philadelphia Councilmanic Committee.

JAMES T. MITCHELL DIES
