

Don't block the fire escapes; you may need them yourself any moment. 5. Don't put ashes in wooden boxes or barrels. 6. Don't permit accumulations of rubbish. 7. Don't have lace curtains or draperies near open lights. 8. Don't fill kerosene lamps or lanterns after dark. 9. Don't permit matches to be used except in a closed metal box. 10. Don't forget to call the fire department if you can't extinguish the flame. Better provide some protection against fire—you never can tell.

Particular attention is being directed by municipal officials to the condition of school buildings and fire drills will be held in all the public schools and similar institutions during the week, particularly on Friday, October 9th, as no sessions will be held on Saturday which has been designated as national fire prevention day, the anniversary of the great Chicago fire. Realizing the great importance of fire drills in public schools, the Safety First Federation has prepared a circular outlining a very simple and practical plan for arranging and conducting public school fire drills. Thousands of these circulars are being distributed by the affiliated organizations throughout this country and Canada, and will be sent to school authorities upon request to the Federation's headquarters, 6 East 39th Street, New York City. The designation of a national fire prevention day in October will make that the banner month in the public safety movement for the year. The first annual convention of the Safety First Federation will follow in ten days, convening in Detroit, October 19th. The fire prevention committee, comprising many prominent fire experts and engineers, will present its report containing important recommendations for adoption at this time. As soon as these measures are approved a comprehensive campaign will be instituted in every Commonwealth and municipality with the view of reducing the fire hazards through the enactment of model laws and regulations. Among the recommendations to be presented at the Detroit convention are the following: 1. The enactment of fire prevention laws in all States in the Union. 2. Designating by legislative approval October 9th as national fire prevention day. 3. Making it obligatory upon school
