

The Association asks justice only, not aims. It requests that every taxpayer, every voter, every resident of this appeal. extension purchase; and then there were powerful and State-wide influences at work to secure favorable action. Were it the individual or the influence that will sway 250 men from every portion of the Commonwealth to the construction of a Harrisburg subway?

Let us imagine that all difficulties are eventually smoothed out. Let us imagine that sometime in the future the Pennsylvania railroad and even the State itself consents to aid. Let us imagine that at length the State street subway has become a reality. It is extremely doubtful if it can ever be made available for general traffic.

A subway with its necessary structural work and provision for the passage of street cars must go some twenty feet beneath the tracks for grade necessary at the Capitol Park entrance could be overcome. There is another factor in this consideration.

It is probable that the State of Pennsylvania after spending over \$2,000,000 for a piece of land to set off its Capitol building, with still further expense in the future for its adornment, would consent to have this park defaced and cut up with a constant procession of heavy traffic, not only of automobiles but of street cars, from the proposed State street subway vanishes into thin air.
