PRICES IRREGULAR IN FIRST HOUR

International Situation Contributes to Feeling of Unrest

New York, Feb. 8. — Rumors dealing with the international situation, which seemed to emanate from professional quarters, contributed to the irregular fluctuations of prices in the first hour.

Selling was light, but congested around such speculative issues as Baldwin Locomotive, Crucible and Marine. In bulk, recessions were averaged about two points from initial maximum. United States Steel, American Smelting and a few distinctive specialties were also affected. Recoveries were quite general in the second hour, another rise in independent steel issues, and in Colorado Fuel and Great Northern Ore, influencing general steadiness. Bonds were irregular.
