Scranton, Pa., April 1.—Visions of wealth which followed the wonderful success that attended the early years of the International Correspondence Schools, visions which led to the incorporation of other companies, some subsidiary to the schools and others closely affiliated with it through interlocking directorates, were dispelled yesterday afternoon when Thomas J. Foster, founder and president of the International Correspondence Schools, filed a voluntary petition in bankruptcy in the United States District Court.
