VELVET RIBBONS AS THE TRIMMING

9106 (With Basting Line and Added Seam Allowance) Child's Dress, 4, 6 and 8 years.

Long waisted effects are very generally becoming to the little girls. This frock shows the kimono sleeves that are always graceful and attractive and at the same time greatly simplify labor. They can be made short or long and the dress can be made with V-shaped or with a high neck. It is available not alone for present needs but also for the future ones, for it can be copied in light weight wool material quite as successfully as in cotton and other materials of the summer. Here, embroidered cotton crepe is trimmed with lace but challis could be made to produce a similar effect, or a plain colored challis would be pretty with bands of velvet ribbon as trimming. Even in mid-summer there are cool days when such a frock would be welcome. For the 6 year size will be needed, 4 1/2 yards of material 27 inches wide, 3 yards 36 or 2 1/2 yards 44, with 5 yards of banding and 4 yards of edging.
