NO WOUNDED ON BOARD BRITANNIC

Fifty Lost and 28 Hurt of Crew and Hospital Corps on Monster Ship

London, Nov. 23.—Press dispatches from Athens saying there were no wounded on board the hospital ship Britannic when it was sunk off the Greek coast were confirmed to-day by the Admiralty.

Of those aboard, fifty were lost, twenty-eight were injured and 1,100 saved.

Admiralty officials have little to add to the official announcement except to state the Britannic was sunk in the daytime. Whether she was torpedoed or mined has not yet been determined, the Athens dispatch not being accepted as official. The Admiralty has been advised that many submarines were operating in the vicinity.

The medical staff and the members of the crew numbered more than 500. The Britannic was the largest British ship afloat. She was completed at the beginning of the war, but her maiden trip to the United States was postponed indefinitely. Since 1914 she has been in the service of the British Government. She was a vessel of 48,158 tons gross register tonnage, and only to the German liner Vaterland among the steamships of the world.

Used as Hospital Ship The Britannic almost since the beginning of the war was used for a hospital ship. She was painted white, and strung between her two forward funnels was a huge Red Cross emblem, illuminated at night by incandescent lights. She was not armed.

As a hospital ship the White Star liner had accommodation for 2,500 injured soldiers, 100 surgeons, 200 nurses and orderlies and a crew of several hundred men.

KELLY WINS OUT Pittsburgh, Pa., Nov. 23.—Former Representative M. Clyde Kelly, member of the Sixty-third Congress as a Progressive Republican will be a member of the Sixty-fifth Congress as a Progressive Democrat, the completion of the official count of the Thirtieth Pennsylvania Congressional district, minus the soldier vote on the border, showing Kelly a victor over the present Congressman, W. H. Coleman by 250 votes. The soldier vote which for this district will be counted officially to-morrow, gave a plurality to Kelly in the unofficial canvass.

THIEVES STEAL BLANKET Not being able to gain an entrance through the back door of the Meyer Gross store, Seventh and Sayford streets, thieves slanted a brick through the front window early this morning and secured a valuable blanket.


BOY'S ARM BROKEN
