GREEKS ACCEPT ALLIED DEMANDS

Begin Delivery of Six Batteries of Mountain Guns to Entente

Athens, Jan. 10, via London, Jan. 11, 6.45 A. M.—The government has formally accepted the ultimatum of the entente powers.

In accordance with the agreement made with the Allies on December 1, King Constantine to-day began delivery to the entente naval authorities of

six batteries of mountain guns. He gave orders to the troops to suppress all hostile demonstration, which was promptly done, and a meeting called to protest against the acceptance of the allied ultimatum. The leaders of the reservists, under pressure from the king, issued a statement that their followers were ready to support the monarch and accept the decisions of his government.

An ultimatum was delivered to the Greek government last November demanding, among other things, that the artillery of the Greek army be turned over to the entente naval authorities. This demand was refused after Germany notified the Athens administration that the surrender of the guns would be considered an unfriendly act. On December 1 allied forces were landed at Piraeus and marched on Athens.

SILENT SENTINELS BRAVE COLD WIND

Suffragists Resume Posts Outside White House; President Smiles

Washington, D. C., Jan. 11.—Suffragists "silent sentinels" resumed duty outside the White House gates despite a freezing wind. They marched over from Congressional Union headquarters with military precision and took up positions flanking the main entrances. They were taken to their posts by "the officer of the day."

President Wilson left the White

House for his usual game of golf before the sentinels went on duty, but they deployed so he could not fail to see their banners when he returned. Because of the cold weather the sentinels were changed at frequent intervals to return to headquarters to warm their feet.

Because of the cold the suffragists did not hold to their posts as rigidly as they did yesterday, but paced up and down the sidewalk in front of the White House. They abandoned their stolid silence of yesterday and discussed suffrage with passers-by.

Each time the White House automobile passed in or out of the grounds the sentinels rushed forward to see whether the President was inside.

When the President and Mrs. Wilson returned from golf the sentinels quickly ran to positions so that they flanked the driveway. The President smiled broadly, but gave no recognition of the pickets.

Hot chocolate to warm the cold nicks was brought over shortly before noon. The wind blew so strong that several of the smaller sentinels found difficulty in holding their banners. Mrs. William Kent, wife of Representative Kent, of California, out on an inspection tour, found one of the pickets shivering with cold and gave the young suffragist her fur coat and spats.

Governor's Troop Coming Home by Way of Memphis

Adjutant General Stewart to-day announced that he had received word that the First Cavalry was returning to the State from El Paso by way of Memphis, Louisville and Pittsburgh, but that no date for arrival in Pennsylvania could be given because of the necessity of stopping trains to water and exercise horses. There are 320 horses belonging to the Government returning with the regiment.

General Stewart said that from information he had received the Fourth Infantry would not return at Harrisburg, but proceed direct to home station.

A. H. Walters May Be Given Pomeroy's Old Place

Governor Brumbaugh is expected to take up the appointment of a superintendent of public printing and binding to-day after he meets with members of the State Panama-Pacific Exposition Commission from this State, which is here for its final session. It is said that the place will be offered to either Anderson H. Walters, of Johnstown, or A. Nevin Detrich, of Chambersburg. Mr. Detrich will not accept, according to reports about the Capitol.

Mr. Detrich, who was here to-day, said that he had not made any claim for mileage for serving as a substitute elector and did not intend to accept either the \$3 for his service or any mileage at all.

AD DEATHS AND FUNERALS

JOHN HOLSTINE
John Holstine, aged 65 years, died yesterday after two years' illness at his home at Hainton. He was a blacksmith for the Pennsylvania Railroad for twenty-seven years. Funeral services will be held Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock from his late residence. Burial will be made in the Shoop's Church Cemetery. He is survived by his wife, Mary, four daughters, Mrs. Jacob Womer, Mrs. Irvin Westhafer, Mrs. Martin Dengler and Gertrude, and four sons, Samuel, Ralph, Frank and William.

DESCENDANT OF WASHINGTON DIES IN PHILADELPHIA
Philadelphia, Jan. 11.—Miss Margaretta Washington, a great-great-grandniece of George Washington, died at her home here to-day. She had a wide reputation among physicians and medical schools for her skill in drawing anatomical sketches. She was also known as a painter of portraits and miniatures.
