MILLERSBURG'S NEW LIGHT PLANT Boilerhouse and Generator Foundations Nearly Completed TROUBLE FROM SNOW New Grandstand and Fence to Be Built at Millersburg Ball Field

Millersburg, Pa., March 10.—Work at the new electric light plant is steadily progressing. The boilerhouse is nearly completed, as is also the concrete foundation for the generators. W. G. Armstrong, representing the Keeler company of Williamsport, completed the erection of the large stack early in the week and now has a force of men moving the large boilers to the plant. On account of the bad condition of the road the work goes slow. At a base ball meeting held on Monday night it was decided to get an estimate on the cost of a new grandstand and fence to take the place of the present unserviceable stand at the old ball park and an effort will also be made to have an objectionable obstruction removed from the left field of the park. The grounds will be placed in better condition than ever before. J. B. Seal, editor of the Millersburg Herald was taken to the Hartman Hospital at Harrisburg, suffering with a complication of ailments. His condition since then is not much improved.
