

Edwin M. Housholder, one of the most active and best-known Republicans of Harrisburg, died this morning at his home, 317 Boas street. He was a Capitol Park policeman and was the oldest precinct leader in the city.

A charter member of the Harrisburg Republican club, he was always active during political campaigns and was usually instrumental in organizing the marching corps for which that organization is famous.

Mr. Housholder died on his sixty-third birthday. He was a native of Plainfield, Cumberland county, but resided in Harrisburg nearly all his life. He is survived by his widow, Maria F., one sister, Margaret Rickenschick, Pittsburgh, and two brothers, Elmer Housholder, of Harrisburg, and John Housholder, of Winchester. The funeral will be held Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock, with services at his home, in charge of the Rev. H. W. A. Hanson, pastor of Messiah Lutheran Church. Interment will be made in the Harrisburg Cemetery.
