0.8 Turn right with macadam. 2.9 Cross bridge. 3.6 Fork: bear right of macadam into dirt road; whitewashed.


6.3 Cross covered bridge. 7.5 At monument turn left on brick wall on left. 8.7 Cross covered bridge.

U. S. to Punish Men Who Fail to Appear for Examination

State draft headquarters to-day announced that word had been received from Washington that a man living in one local draft district who is examined and accepted in another district where he applies for examination because of temporary residence will be applied to his local board by telegram for leave to go to a mobilization camp with men from his district where he was accepted.

According to the procedure as outlined at the draft headquarters in the cases of men who give false addresses and who do not appear when summoned the Adjutant General of the Army will proceed against them. The list of slackers in one Philadelphia district was received to-day from Clinton Rogers Woodruff and note will be made of the names. Under the law local boards certify such men to district boards and at the same time names go to the Department of Justice in Washington.


Sam Hoover, Old-time Baseball Star, a Victim of Pneumonia
