

GREEKS FILING MOST APPEALS

Italians and Spaniards Ob-jecting to Going to the Mobilization Camps

According to what has been turning up in the reports and appeals filed at the State Draft Registration Headquarters, Italians and Spaniards in Pennsylvania have figured chiefly as the aliens who did not respond to the orders to report for military service on advice of their consular officials. Greeks have filed more appeals than any other aliens. Very few men from the British empire or the French republic have filed claims and none has refused to go to camp.

TWO DIE WHEN BRIDGE DROPS

Thomas Snell, of Steelton, and George Weiger, of City, Victims of Auto Accident

George Weiger, brother of John Weiger, 1340 Penn street, this city, and Thomas Snell, aged 30, brother of William Snell, 18 South Second street, Steelton, were killed, and Alexander Mourer Jr., 402 Forster street, was injured when the automobile in which they were riding crashed through a bridge crossing Jack's creek, two miles east of Lewistown, late yesterday afternoon.

Snell and Weiger had been walking toward Harrisburg when Mourer came along in his automobile and offered to take them along, just a short time before the accident occurred. Mourer escaped injury when he was thrown from the car when the bridge collapsed. The two men in the tonneau of the car went down with the wreckage to the bottom of the creek, about thirty-five feet below.

Mourer was brought to his home here and today said he was in good condition. He is not injured seriously. Mourer is an employee of the Cumberland Valley Telephone Company.


