

HUGE GAIN MADE BY STATE BANKS

Trust Companies Show Remarkable Jump in Deposits and Depositors

Resources of trust companies, state banks and savings institutions under supervision of the State Banking Department advanced from \$1,548,123,496.89 on November 11, 1916, to \$1,615,968,262.12 on March 22, 1917, according to a summary of the figures obtained under the call for statements as of the latter date issued to-day by Commissioner of Banking Daniel F. Lafaen.

In the same time the number of depositors went up from 2,571,957 to 2,831,750, the highest number of depositors ever known in the history of the state. Deposits rose from \$1,152,528,670.21 to \$1,217,844,817.10, establishing a new high mark. Postal savings deposits were \$1,766,484.74 in November and \$1,620,576.74.

There were 903 trust companies reporting, showing 1,282,892 deposits and resources of \$1,078,819,555.19; 198 state banks, with 697,534 depositors and \$256,849,536.94 resources; 11 savings institutions, with 531,531 depositors and \$280,399,532.65 resources.
