

VICTORY ONLY TO SAVE AMERICANS, BISHOP WARNS

Reveals Colonization of Brazil and Plans For Domination

Chicago, Dec. 7.—Bishop Homer C. Stuntz of the Methodist Episcopal Church of Omaha, who was for four years bishop in South America, stirred the Methodist social union banquet at the Hotel Morrison with an unqualified endorsement of President Wilson's message favoring a declaration of war on Austria and a war to victory against Germany and the central powers.

Bishop Stuntz let in the light on Germany's intrigues in South America based on his personal knowledge and documentary evidence and declared the subjugation of America was a part of Germany's plan whether defeated or victorious, and on that account the United States must be prepared to defend herself against future attacks, even after Germany is defeated in the present war.

Peace Only With Victory
"In endorsing hearty President Wilson's declaration that peace can only follow victory by the United States and her Allies, because we are not fighting for territory but for principles," he said.

"These questions cannot be settled around a table by diplomats parading out territory, but by bringing Germany to a place where she will give up her doctrine of might makes right."

"I was in South America when the United States declared war. The Germans in Brazil, and there are 400,000 over there, were wild with joy. They felt 'der tag' the day had arrived and they said it will be only a short time before Brazil with its rich supplies of coffee, sugar and cattle will be in possession of Germany."

Germans Colonizing Brazil
"I frequently visited Rio de Janeiro while I lived in Buenos Aires and talked with editors, diplomats and leading citizens and it was common talk Germany was carrying on a systematic colonization with the ultimate purpose of gaining a controlling influence on the American continent."


"When the British were driving the Germans out of South Africa, the discovery was made of documentary evidence showing the exact amount of supplies Brazil could furnish and the plans whereby the Germans of Brazil were to assist the Germans of Africa, Cape Town, Africa, being only an eleven day trip from the principal South American port."

"It was well known before the war no German man was allowed to come to Brazil without having first served in the German army, so most of the colonists are trained soldiers. The immigrants had their passage paid by the German government. The school teachers taught German in the schools and were paid from Berlin."

"This is peculiarly our war, for it is a war for the principles for which Americans have given their lives in the past and on which we wrote the declaration of independence. It is our war because Germany has included America in her plans of conquest. Prussian autocracy stands in the way of the international brotherhood towards which the spirit of the age is moving."

"The war will so bring the nations together that the parliament of man, the federation of the world will be advanced further than it would have been in 150 years by the slow progress of evolution. Out of the struggle against Napoleon the missionary movement of the church arose, which is transforming the Orient, and out of the present struggle against the German kaiser, the Nation of the twentieth century will come the brotherhood of the nations."

"Thursday we were on a hike again and we walked one of the miles to death that was hauling the mess wagon, so I guess we are get-

ting pretty hard, don't you think? It was supposed to be a 25-mile hike. We left at nine A. M. and got back at nine P. M.

"I suppose you have seen the papers about Russia being out of the war. Well, that leaves it up to the United States and I wouldn't be sur-

prised if after our sixteen weeks training is up we will be shipped to France for the Spring drive. We are on the twelfth week now. Everything points to a speedy departure and it can't come too soon. Our drills have all changed since the French officers are here."
