

“DRY” WORKERS PLAN BIG RALLY

W. C. T. U. to Join With Churchmen and Laymen in Movement

Arrangements have been completed for a meeting of temperance workers of Dauphin county to be held in Grace Methodist Church, afternoon and night of Tuesday, February 13.

In the call being signed to the churches for announcement of this meeting, each church is authorized to send to the afternoon meeting the pastor and three other representatives for each hundred members over which call other churches of the county have since joined.

In the invitation to the churches to join in this meeting the following statement of the object of the meeting is made: "This meeting is not to promise support to any political party nor to any named candidates, nor to any faction of any party, but is to try to agree on a method for securing the nomination in Dauphin county in all parties of candidates for the Legislature pledged to vote, if elected, for the ratification by Pennsylvania of the prohibition amendment to the United States Constitution submitted by the present Congress."
