

UPPER END WATER COMPANY IS HIT

Gets Drastic Order to Make Improvements to Its System Within Five Days



The Public Service Commission today issued an order on the Williams Valley Water Company, operating in Williamsport and vicinity, to repair and improve its water supply line in Williamsport creek and vicinity.

The order also directs the Commission's engineers to make an inspection of the plant and system "with a view to determining permanent improvements necessary to be made in order that an adequate supply of water for fire protection may be furnished."

The order is the most drastic issued by the Commission in any similar case. Twenty units in—Over twenty units of the Reserve Militia of Pennsylvania have been mustered into the state service according to orders of the Adjutant General's Department, eleven of them being in the First Infantry alone.
