Representatives of Czech Nation Demand the Right of Self-Determination

Washington, March 14.—Representatives of the Czech nation at Prague have made a public declaration of their nation's unshakable will and unassailable right to self-determination and complete political independence from Austria.

The declaration, adopted by unanimous vote, is looked upon as proof of the sentiment of the whole of the Bohemian Crown met in Prague January 6 with more than 250 Czech deputies of the Austrian Reichstag and the national Diets of Bohemia, Moravia and Silesia, effected by the free choice of the people of the Czech lands.
