

BUSINESS NOT AFRAID OF WAR

"Sit Tight" Is Advice of State Credit Men Meeting Here

"Sit tight; hold your nerve; don't gossip and don't gamble and there will be no panic in America as a result of this war," was the message sent out to-day by the Credit Men of Pennsylvania who held their annual convention at the Board of Trade building.

It was the substantial talk of A. D. Saltee, of the firm of R. G. Dunn & Co., Pittsburgh, which brought up credit and the war and possible panic. The discussion was thrown wide open with pertinent questions.

Nearly all the speakers gave much praise to the Federal Reserve Banks which they declared are so efficient that they had not established in 1907 a panic could have occurred.
