

STATE DRUGGISTS HOLDING SESSIONS AT HARVEY'S LAKE

Members of Association Make Recommendations of State-Wide Importance

Wilkes-Barre, June 28.—Recommendations of state-wide importance were made in reports given by officers and prominent members of the Pennsylvania Pharmaceutical Association at the seventh and eighth sessions held at the Onocoma Hotel, Harvey's Lake.

The committee on the time and place of the next annual convention of the Pennsylvania Pharmaceutical Association, held at the Onocoma Hotel, Harvey's Lake, on June 28, 1918, recommended that the convention be held in June, 1919, at a tri-state convention, including the States of Pennsylvania, New York and New Jersey.

The first recommendation embodied in the report of the legislative committee, given by Charles F. Kramer, was that an active propaganda campaign should be inaugurated to secure the passage of the Edmonds bill designed to provide a pharmaceutical corps in the Army.

The maintenance of the high standard of the pharmacist in securing only qualified druggists as helpers in retail stores was strongly urged in a paper read by Professor J. W. Sturmer, of Philadelphia, a member of the faculty of the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy, entitled "The Acid Test."

U. S. SOLDIERS TO HAVE THEIR OWN DIVISIONS

London, June 28.—Intervening in the debate on the new military service act and speaking of the urgency of obtaining men for a serious emergency, Premier Lloyd George said yesterday it was true the Americans were coming and being brigaded with the Allies, but that it was on the distinct understanding that when men were obtainable they should replace the Americans and enable them to form their own divisions.
