

Austrians Fall Back in Grappa; Yanks Open Fire on Front in Verdun Area

London, Nov. 1.—The British troops on the Italian front have occupied the town of Sacle, on the Livenna, fifteen miles east of the Piave, the war office announces.

With the American Army Northwest of Verdun, Nov. 1.—Greatly increased artillery fire by the American Army and light batteries began this morning all along the front of the American first army.

Paris, Nov. 1.—Violent artillery battles were in progress during last night on the French front along the Oise near Guise and in the Aisne region near St. Fergoux, northwest of Chateau Porcien, according to today's war office announcement.

Berlin Recalls Bernstorff to "Advise" on Americans

Basel, Switzerland, Nov. 1.—The Frankfurter Zeitung a copy of which has been received here, says Count Bernstorff, German ambassador to Turkey, will arrive in Berlin Friday, having been recalled from the Constantinople embassy less on account of recent events in Turkey than the necessity to have some one in Berlin especially acquainted with American matters.

The newspaper adds that the Turkish ambassador in Berlin, Turkish officers in Germany and two Turkish prices who were studying in the German capital have been recalled to Turkey.

Snipers Dress for Fancy Ball Before Going to Work

Behind the American Lines in France.—The American sniper wears a fantastic suit of green burlap, with tufts of raffa, or Madagascarr grass, sewed thickly all over the coat and trousers. The coat has a headpiece with eyeholes so that the sniper's head is completely enveloped.

American troops in the Vosges have used these camouflage suits with great effect. The grass-covered burlap is merged into the grass through which the sniper crawls, and even when only twenty-five feet distant his presence cannot be detected.

These suits are made by French women in the American camouflage station behind the lines. The "disappearing building" is one of the curious contrivances of the camouflage artists here. The building is the size of a two-story frame cottage viewed close at hand it stands out plainly enough, and even at 100 feet the cottage is quite clear. But at the distance from which the enemy observations would be made, or from an airplane at 8,000 feet, the building does in fact "disappear." This is done by the painting in of great wavy lines of green and brown which, at a distance, obliterate the straight lines of roof, gable, windows and doors, and transform the whole structure into a blur of green-brown color which blends into the grass and ground.

Haig Strikes Again on Front at Valenciennes

London, Nov. 1.—The British troops used the offensive south of Valenciennes this morning. Field Marshal Haig, in his report to-day, says good progress is being made. Field Marshal Haig's forces made good progress in their attack this morning in the region of Valenciennes. That it is reported to be surrounded on three sides. MARKETS

New York, Nov. 1.—Wall Street buoyancy characterized the active opening of today's stock market. War news stimulating a renewal of the recent broad demand, Mexican Petroleum led with an initial gain of seven points, shippings and some of the prominent specialties advancing 2 to 3 1/2. Copper, motors, fertilizers and distilling interests, together with some of the munitions, gained 1 to 2 points, but U. S. Steel made very slight improvement. Investment rails, especially the pacific, Pennsylvania and Coals advanced 1 to 2 points.

The early advance halted temporarily on further selling of U. S. Steel which reacted 1 1/2 points and weakness of Bethlehem Steel which broke three points. Other war shares were strong, especially Baldwin Locomotive and Pullman. Rails, shippings, motors and metals eased slightly, but oils made almost steady progress. Mexican Petroleum continuing to feature at an extreme advance of 10 1/2 points, with five for Royal Dutch and 4 for Texas Company. Tobacco, fertilizers and gas shares also responded to steady buying. Anglo-French rose a fraction to 96, the year's highest price.
