Gettysburg, Pa., Nov. 2.—Adams county again showed its generosity and the great enterprises growing out of the war by its contribution of clothing for the Belgians. The amount requested was doubled by the citizens of the county through the local Red Cross, and almost all of the materials given were practically new and not of the wornout variety, some of the gifts showing real sacrifices on the part of the givers. Altogether seven tons of clothing went out of the county to help in keeping warm the Belgian sufferers during the cold winter months. Gettysburg is to be one of the links in the great motor mail truck and parcel post system of the government between Baltimore and Pittsburgh. The service has been in operation for some time between this place and Baltimore and later another true link was established between Gettysburg and the other, and now the service is to be extended from the latter place to the Pennsylvania Valley metropolis. The present system between McConnellsburg and Baltimore will be continued, by which Gettysburg is a sister city with the Rev. Ira S.
