Drafted Men Will Move Next Week

Train schedules for the movement of the more than 6,000 men called to go to Camp Meade and Crane next week have been completed at State Draft headquarters and the men will entrain on November 11, 12, 13, 14 and 15, several special trains being provided.

The 500 men, white and colored, called for the Navy, will entrain Saturday. They will report at 1515 Arch street, Philadelphia. The voluntary period on this call expired yesterday, but it will be necessary to draft men.

Reserve Companies to Be Maintained

Major Henry M. Stine, commandant of the Harrisburg Reserves, today issued orders for the Reserves to resume drills at the armory on Friday night at 7.30. The captains were directed to ascertain the number of men active prior to the influenza epidemic which caused suspension of drills at the end of September.

Friday night the work for the remainder of the year will be out of the line as it is intended to continue the Reserves until the end of the war for any purposes which may arise, and to arrange details for the continuation of the drills of the students of the Harrisburg High schools.

School Libraries to Be Redistributed

Harrisburg's Public Library, which resumed its work in the community this morning after having been closed for over a month by the influenza epidemic, will begin its school libraries on Monday in charge of Miss Helen Allen, who will also direct the story telling among the children.

The libraries have been redistributed by Miss Alice R. Eaton, the librarian, and there will be ten instead of seven as last year. This distribution was made to meet a constantly growing demand and if funds are available there will be a further extension. There are 745 books in the school libraries.
