

**BITUMINOUS COAL DEMAND IS LESS**

Production Cut 35 Per Cent. to Keep Market Prices Firm

Altoona, Pa., Jan. 28.—Bituminous coal production in the Central Pennsylvania field has been reduced approximately 35 per cent. because of a lack of demand for coal. Rather than demoralize the market by cutting prices, operators are closing down the mines temporarily. A little coal has been sold under the government price at \$2.91 but it had already been mined and was loaded on cars awaiting shipment. Coal operators say the supply is long all over the country, especially in New England, where many of the large consumers have a stock on hand sufficient to last them from four to seven months. At tide-water ports the demand has also suddenly dropped.

**R. F. WEBSTER IS HONORED BY OWLS**



**APPEALS BOARDS DO GREAT WORK**

Act on 327,742 Petitions; Grant the Greater Number Filed



Major W. G. Murdock, the state's chief draft officer, today completed data which shows that the nine district appeal boards of Pennsylvania acted on 327,742 appeals and claims. Of this number 237,065 were granted and 100,677 denied.

In addition to these figures there were 1,058 appeals from physical examinations acted upon. A few years ago under a treaty with Canada the shooting of these birds, which are known as rice birds in the south, was forbidden.



**Proposes Organization of Discharged Soldiers Into One Organization**

The first annual convention of the American Army Association, to be composed of the members of the armies stationed in America and overseas during the war, will begin Sunday, April 6, with memorial services, and continue five days. Mayor Keister has received notification from Haywood H. Hill, Jr., secretary of the National Association, of the proposed organization of discharged soldiers all over the country into an association similar to the G. A. R., and has been asked to cooperate in bringing the soldiers of the county together into an organization.

**Methodist Churches to Maintain "Good Will" Schools For Soldiers**

New York, Jan. 28.—"Good will" schools to provide industrial re-education for discharged soldiers will be maintained in thirty cities throughout the country by the Methodist Episcopal Church with its share of the \$10,000,000 to be raised next month for reconstruction work by fourteen Protestant denominations.
