Manchester, Pa., March 12.—Since the organization in December, 1917, until the present time, the Manchester branch of the American Red Cross completed 3,673 garments,

A report of the articles completed is here given: Sixty convalescent suits, 85 pillow cases, 49 bed jackets, 75 towels, 25 spits underwear, 250 comfort kits, 200 bags,

60 French petticoats, 40 convalescent robes, 50 pairs socks, 30 serge dresses, 25 house dresses, 45 women's waists, surgical work, 45 paper back pads, 75 scoutlets, 1,250 shot bags, 70 cotton pads, 312 wipes, 548 army pads, 236 compresses, 8 pneumonia jackets, knitted articles, 50 soldiers' sweaters, 10 pair wristlets, 5 pairs socks and 1 blanket.
