

CIVIC BODIES UNITE TO MAKE BETTER CITY

Big Program Outlined For Future; Colonel Martin Praises Action Looking Toward Model Municipality

First plans in the campaign to make Harrisburg the model city of the country, were outlined at a meeting of representatives from various civic organizations held in the Chamber of Commerce rooms last night.

What has already been done to make this city the finest in the nation, was told by Col. Edward Martin, State Commissioner of Health, who said: "To prove that Harrisburg has improved, the State Health Department has moved its entire force to this city. We would never have even considered this twelve years ago."

A permanent organization "for the betterment of health and sanitary conditions in this city" was formed. George S. Reinohl, president of the Harrisburg Chamber of Commerce, was elected chairman unanimously. Warren R. Jackson, secretary of the Chamber, was also elected secretary of this organization.

Major McLane, Deputy State Health Commissioner, called for a contagious disease hospital, picturing the dangers of so-called "harmless" diseases. 


