

DRESSMAKERS PLAN CONVENTION

Manufacturers of Women's Garments Will Meet in Atlantic City

New York, Oct. 3.—A convention of manufacturers of women's, misses' and children's dresses, located in all parts of the United States, will take place under the auspices of the Associated Dress Industries of America, the national trade body, in Atlantic City during the last week of November.

The proposed convention is the first one of its kind ever held in the women's garment manufacturing trade, and will bring together, according to a statement issued today by Executive Director David N. Mesessohn, about 500 manufacturers doing an annual business of over \$150,000,000.

Preparations for the convention are now being worked out by a committee, and Mr. Mesessohn will visit Atlantic City next week to make arrangements.

It is expected that the following cities will send representatives: New York, Philadelphia, Cleveland, Baltimore, Cincinnati, Chicago, Milwaukee, San Francisco, Los Angeles, St. Louis, Kansas City and Detroit. New York city will send over 500 representatives.

Trained Milling Men Are Sought

New York, Oct. 3.—Trained men of milling and grain experience are being sought by the United States Grain Corporation in the grain-dust explosion and fire prevention campaign recently inaugurated by that government body in co-operation with the United States Department of Agriculture. Applications for this work should be forwarded to C. L. Alsborg, chief of the Bureau of Chemistry, Washington, D. C., with a detailed statement of the experience and training of the applicant. Appointments will be made as soon as properly trained men can be secured. Salaries will range from \$1,620 to \$2,400, determined by the training and experience of the applicant.

Those eligible for these positions must have milling, mechanical, electrical, agricultural or chemical engineering education, training or experience, practical experience in grain mills and elevators in the handling, manufacture and production of flour, feeds and grain products or experience in the manufacture, design, or construction of grain cleaning and handling equipment for mills and elevators.

Leaders Will Decide U. S. Export Policies

New York, Oct. 3.—Whatever developments come in Washington regarding the peace treaty, certain foreign trade policies will be determined and export practices adopted at the annual convention of the American Manufacturers Association which will take place here Oct. 16 and 17. This statement was made by Robert F. Valentine, executive secretary of the association.

"The urgent need for stabilizing and standardizing our export business is widely recognized," said Mr. Valentine. "The dates for our convention have been finally set and the topics for discussion decided upon. After the discussions certain resolutions will be passed and these will embody principles to which the members of the organization will adhere."

Ask Kentucky to End Pari Mutuel Betting

Lexington, Ky., Oct. 3.—Legislation for the abolition of the pari mutuel form of betting on Kentucky race-tracks will be introduced at the coming session of the General Assembly, Dr. W. S. Lockhart, executive secretary of the Churchmen's Federation of Louisville, announced at a meeting of Protestant ministers. Denouncing gambling on race-tracks as one of the greatest evils, Dr. Lockhart declared that the federation would enlist the aid of every Protestant church in the State to support the bill.

Discussing the proposed legislation regarding the pari mutuel form of betting, Dr. Lockhart said that it was an evil which was practiced on Kentucky race-tracks and at Baltimore more than in any other place in the United States.

Canada's Wheat Crop 162,326,400 This Year

Winnipeg, Oct. 3.—Western Canada's wheat crop this year will total 162,326,400 according to an official expert estimate just made. Of this total Manitoba will produce 28,999,100 bushels of wheat, 38,221,000 and Alberta 27,106,300. The estimated crop of other grains in the three prairie provinces is: Oats, 224,047,900 bushels; barley, 45,935,000; rye, 5,722,000 and flax 7,099,000 bushels. This estimate, officials say, is on the conservative side and later information will probably be even more encouraging. Despite light crops in some areas many farmers of Western Canada will make money this year.

To Raise \$500,000 For Louvain Library

New York, Oct. 3.—A campaign to raise \$500,000 to build a new library as a gift from the American people to the University of Louvain, which was wrecked by the Germans in their advance over Belgium in 1914, has been launched by the national committee for the restoration of the University of Louvain. The library will be America's share in the international project to restore the university as a memorial to the heroism of the Belgians. Cardinal Mercier has given his sanction to the plan.


