

Thousands of Jews in Pinsk Destitute

New York, Oct. 23.—Pinsk, Poland, which was reported some time ago the scene of a bloody pogrom that stirred the Jews of every coun-

try in the world, is to-day a city of starvation and fear, according to a communication just received by the American Jewish Relief Committee from Dr. Boris Egen, executive director from Poland of the Joint Committee Distribution of American Funds for Jewish War Sufferers. About 18,000 Jews in Pinsk are

absolutely destitute, Dr. Egen reports. Practically no food can be bought in the open market. Charity is administered under military observation, and soldiers attend all relief meetings.

New York, Oct. 23.—The Merchants' Association has sent telegrams to Postmaster General Burleson and Secretary of War Baker.

The telegrams said that the delay in outgoing foreign mails through postponed sailings is causing serious disruption to business correspondence, and asked the Postoffice Department for more general use of army transports for first-class mail whenever contracts between the department and the shipping companies permit.


