The Stevens Memorial M. E. Church to Open Series of Entertainments

More elaborate than ever are the plans of the Stevens Memorial Methodist Episcopal Church, for the Christmas season. To-morrow evening at 7.30, will be the beginning of a series of entertainments, treats, receptions and other events that will give the Christmas celebration its keynote of joyousness in this church.
