

From a Hartley Boy at the Front. Camp of 25th Regt. Cavalry. Within six miles of Richmond, Nov. 29, '64.

The weather is very fine, now, after the cold spell of last week. There is one of the largest fleets in the James River, before Dutch Gap, that has ever been known to be there. Most of the Monitors from Charleston are here, among which is the famous New Ironsides, which is considered to be the most formidable vessel afloat. The sick and wounded are all being sent away to the North. Everything, I think, indicates a move. I think Richmond will fall this time, and with it will be the destruction of the main army of the Rebels. You wanted to know if there were more deserters coming into our lines, since the Election, than before. Our regiment picks out the extreme right of Gen. Butler's line. I am now marching with four of the officers of the Regiment, and have a good opportunity to know what is going on. They say there are a great many more coming in now than before, and I have talked with a great many of the men, and they all say there is twice as many coming in now. The Rebels all seem to think that the Confederacy is about played out. One of our men told me that there was a deserter told him the other day that he knew half of his regiment would desert when an opportunity presents itself. This is certainly encouraging news, as it shows the feeling that prevails in the Rebel army. Our army is in splendid condition. The news from Sherman is very encouraging. I am going to take a ride out to Dutch Gap to-morrow, if I can find time. I want to see the fleet that is laying in the River. I am well, and continue to like it.
