SLIGHT DECLINE IN SALT MEATS

Wholesale Prices a Little Off. No Change in Retail Prices in Markethouse.

In the wholesale quotations a slight decline is noted in salt meats and lard, of an average of 1 cent per pound, except for hams and center cut bacon, which are firm at the prices of a week ago. Dry salt extras have declined from 30 cents per pound to 28 cents; fat backs from 28 cents per pound to 25 cents; loin cuts, butts from 24 cents to 23 cents; clear bellies from 33 cents to 32 cents; regular plates from 25 cents per pound to 27 cents.

The decline in lard is from 1/2 cent to 1 cent per pound.

There are no changes in the wholesale prices of sausages, produce or fresh meats, except that strictly fresh eggs have advanced from 55 cents to 63 cents.

Irish potatoes have advanced from \$1.50 to \$1.60 per bushel.

In fruits, Ben Davis apples are quoted at \$5.60 per barrel, an advance of \$1.10. Florida oranges advanced from \$4.50 to \$5 per box.

In vegetables, onions have advanced from \$2.75 to \$3.50 per bag.

Sweet potatoes have advanced a cent per pound, now being held at 4 cents.

Carrots are quoted at \$1.75 per tub, and beets at \$1.75 per tub.

Rutabaga turnips are held at 2 1/2 cents per pound.

An advance of 5 cents per 48-pound sack is noted in meal, bolted being \$1.97 and unbolted \$1.20.

"Homestead," a mixed brand of flour, is quoted at \$1.25 per barrel, on a basis of 98-pound sacks.

Grain and feedstuffs have made another advance to higher levels. No. 1 timothy has gone up 10 cents, from \$1.90 to \$2; No. 2 timothy, 15 cents higher, from \$1.80 to \$1.95; No. 1 clover and timothy hay, 15 cents higher, from \$1.85 to \$2; No. 1 clover hay, 10 cents higher, from \$1.80 to \$1.90.

Corn has advanced from \$1.75 to \$1.90. Purina dairy feed advanced from \$3 to \$3.20.

Cream salt, in 200-pound sacks, has advanced from \$1.25 to \$1.50.
