RUSSIAN DECISION MADE BY MAJORITY OF ONE VOTE

Petrograd, Wednesday, Feb. 20.—Decision of the soldiers and workmen's delegates to accept the German peace terms was reached by a majority of only one vote, after a heated debate lasting throughout Monday night.

Premier Lenine, Foreign Minister Trotsky, Ensign Krylenko, commander-in-chief, and many leaders addressed the council. Military men explained the impossibility of offering effective resistance but no decision was reached until messages had been received showing that the Germans had captured Dvinsk with ease and were advancing all along the front.

Sent Wireless at 5 a. m. This news reached the council early Tuesday morning and influenced the delegates to decide for peace. Before the capture of Dvinsk, Premier Lenine said he was opposed to peace, but finally urged that peace must be obtained at any price in order to insure the reconstruction of Russia.

The announcement of Russia's decision to accept the German terms was sent by wireless at 5 o'clock Tuesday morning. At first the German wireless station showed a disposition to refuse to take the message, but finally, four hours later, acknowledged it.

Bolshevik leaders held repeated conferences through Tuesday, and later in the afternoon received the German reply refusing to accept the wireless as official and requesting that a delegation be sent to Dvinsk to confer with regard to peace.

Moral Victory for Bolsheviks. The Russian press is divided as to the wisdom of the council's decision. The Pravda says the soldiers and workmen's delegates have again shown a willingness to make peace and carry out their pledges and that whether Germany accepts the offer or not, the Bolsheviks will have a moral victory.

The Nova Jia says the Bolsheviks have brought the affair to an ignominious end and have proved themselves to be adventurers who are willing to keep themselves in power at any price.

Will Defend Petrograd. Bolshevik leaders declare that if the German advance continues they will defend Petrograd with the red guard and harass the German advance by guerrilla warfare. No plans had been made for evacuation of the city.

The Bolsheviks say this is a new war, not the old war, and that they will present a united front against the Germans. They believe the proletariat of Russia will be able to continue the struggle.

Newspaper opinion as to the Germans' plans is divided. Some of the papers believe Petrograd will be attacked, but others regard this as improbable.

The soldiers' and workmen's deputies decided that only one member of the delegation which represents Russia at

the Brest-Litovsk conference should go to Dvinsk to deliver to the Germans an official copy of the announcement that Germany's terms had been accepted. No announcement has been made as to the selection of a delegate or the time of his departure.

HASTEN RAILWAY STOCK REPAIRS

McAdoo and Labor Chief Reach Agreement Involving Longer Hours and Open Shop.

Washington, Feb. 21.—To hasten repair work on locomotives and railway rolling stock, an agreement involving lengthening of working hours, promotion of apprentices and helpers and maintenance of open shop conditions has been reached between Director General McAdoo and A. G. Wharton, president of the railway employes' department of the American Federation of Labor. The agreement affects more than 300,000 workmen.

At shops and roundhouses now working one shift which totals less than seventy hours per week an increase in working hours will be made probably on a seven-day basis. In certain shops where congestion is most serious men may be required to work ten or even eleven hours, with overtime pay on the present basis, pending consideration by the railroad wage commission.

Quit Work 4 p. m. One Day. In certain shops arrangements will be made to quit work at 4 p. m. one day each week. Local provisions on working hours will be determined by railroad executives in conference with railroad administration officials and union leaders.

The agreement provides for maintenance of open shop and nondiscrimination on the ground of union affiliations in these words: "Mechanics applying for employment will not be denied such employment for any cause other than inability to perform the work."

Apprentices who have served three years may be promoted to a mechanic's position and paid the existing rate of wages for that work, the agreement provides. These promoted apprentices are to be given the right of practical experience on work of their trades to which they had not been advanced during the three-year period.

Provide War Promotions. Helpers with five or more years' experience may be promoted to the class of mechanics when necessary. They are to receive mechanic's wages and have opportunity to learn all branches of the trade. The agreement provides that the ratio of promoted helpers shall not exceed 20 per cent. of the number of mechanics in any trade in a single shop.

The promotions for these classes are to be made on the understanding that they are necessitated by the war emergency and are to cease at the close of the war.

FOUR SHIPS FROM GERMANY ARRIVE

Haparanda, Sweden, Feb. 21.—Four steamships have arrived at Vasa, in the Gulf of Bothnia, from Germany, carrying again a number of soldiers, who had served in the German army, and a number of German volunteers. The vessels also carried a large number of guns, machine guns, rifles and munitions.

Vasa, also called Nikolaistad, is the capital of the province of Vasa, in western Finland. The province has an area of 16,084 square miles and a population of about 450,000. Vasa, the town, is 327 miles by rail northwest of Helsingfors and has steamer communication with Harnosand, Sweden. The town has a population of 11,000.

WARNING AGAINST POORLY EXECUTED \$5 CERTIFICATE

Washington, Feb. 21.—Warning of a poorly executed counterfeit of the \$5 silver certificate was issued today by W. H. Moran, chief of the secret service. It is of the 1899 series with check letters omitted and the signatures of the register and treasurer indecipherable. It is easily detected as a counterfeit.

WILEY BAILEY DRAWS SIXTY AND \$50 FOR BOOTLEGGING

Wiley Bailey was found guilty in the criminal court Thursday morning on the charge of selling whisky and was sentenced to serve sixty days and pay a fine of \$50 and the costs. The officers making the arrest had a sale on Bailey which he could not very well travel against.

REPORT IN FAVOR OF FINANCE BILL

Administration Plan to Create Corporation to Aid War Industries Wins Approval.

Washington, Feb. 21.—By unanimous action, the administration bill to create a war finance corporation, with capital of \$4,500,000,000, to extend government aid to war industries, was ordered favorably reported today by the senate finance committee.

One of the most important amendments adopted by the committee would take from the directors of the corporation the power to license private security issues and place it in the hands of a "capital issues committee" appointed by the federal reserve board and to include three members of that board and not more than seven members in all.

Another important amendment would limit the directors' power to make direct loans, not through banking agencies. Such loans might be made only to railroads, utilities or going organizations necessary or contributory to the prosecution of the war and which were, in the judgment of the directors, of "exceptional importance in public interest."

The bill also was amended to make the director of the corporation appointable by the president, with confirmation by the senate instead of by Secretary McAdoo.

Mr. McAdoo, however, has agreed to all the amendments and it is believed they will command the support of the republicans.

FRENCH AVIATOR REACHES HOLLAND

Amsterdam, Feb. 21.—Lieut. Roland G. Garros, the famous French aviator, and Lieut. Antonio M. Chal, who flew over Berlin in the summer of 1916, and was forced to descend a few kilometers from the Russian lines, reached Holland yesterday. According to Les Nouvelles de Maastricht, they escaped from a German prison.

Lieut. Marchal, starting from French soil, flew over Berlin in July, 1916, dropping proclamations, and continued his flight with the intention of landing within the Russian lines. He was forced by engine trouble to descend in Poland and was taken prisoner by the Austrians. He made a continuous flight of more than 800 miles, establishing a record. Lieut. Garros was a prominent aviator before the war holding several world's records. He brought down a number of German airplanes and was taken prisoner in the spring of 1915.
