CHASERS CONVERGE ON VIRGINIA CAPES

Pinar Del Rio Survivors Declare Submarine Was Accompanied by Steamer.

(International News Service.) Washington, June 11.—Reports made by survivors of the American freighter Pinar Del Rio, who have arrived at Norfolk, that the submarine which sank their vessel was accompanied by a large steamer and also that it sank two American sailing vessels while they were in sight are being carefully investigated by the navy department.

All manner of submarine chasers are converging on the Virginia capes in an effort to get the submarines. So far as the navy is concerned, no claim is made that any of the submarines actually has been located or sunk.

At the navy department it was again stated today that complete publicity will be given such details of the submarine chase as can be revealed and it was again asserted that if a submarine is sunk or captured the navy will make the fact known.

ALLIES READY TO INVADE SIBERIA IF U. S. ASSENTS

Wilson's Objections May Be Moved by Changed Conditions.

Moscow.—An extremely important decision was taken last night when the executive committee instructed the commissariat of war to prepare within a week a scheme of compulsory recruiting one or more classes in the Moscow and Petrograd districts and in the Don region and Kuban. The choice of districts was dictated by the consideration that Moscow and Petrograd are the greatest industrial centers and consequently contain the largest proportion of workmen who are politically self-conscious and therefore ready to understand the need and to support the Soviets in carrying out the measures which will certainly be made to suppress the anti-Soviet agitation by the Germans and the counter-revolutionary elements, whose interests are directly threatened by everything that increases the military power of the Soviet government.

Cossacks Ask to Be Recruited. Similarly in the Don region and in Kuban the openly reactionary character of the pro-Soviet government was clearly illustrated to the Cossack working classes the need of immediate resistance that they themselves are asking to be mobilized, and many local soviets already have introduced conscriptive methods.

Personally, I consider that the government is taking a considerable risk in so soon taking the decisive step from the voluntary system to conscription. Even if they succeed in carrying it through, clearer proof could not be asked of their real existence as a government.

"TIME WHEN KINGS MUST STICK TOGETHER" WON

Letter From Emperor Charles Made Pacifist of King of Rumania.

(Associated Press.) London, June 11.—A private letter written to King Ferdinand of Rumania by Emperor Charles of Austria-Hungary in the latter part of February marked the turning point in Rumania's participation in the world war and was one of the deciding factors in the long series of intrigues which eventually broke the spirit of the Rumanian king. Under outside pressure King Ferdinand changed from an ardent supporter of the war against Germany into a lukewarm and vacillating opportunist, and finally into a distinct peace advocate.

GIST OF WAR SITUATION AS GIVEN BY THE TWO NEWS SERVICES

(International News Service.) The Germans have intensified their efforts to break through on the twenty-one-mile front south of Noyon and Montdidier, but are meeting with stern resistance everywhere.

(Associated Press.) Moving with steadiness, in spite of the frightful losses inflicted upon them, the Germans, in their plunge southward on the line from Montdidier to Compiègne, to gain here and there in the center of the line, where their greatest effort has been exerted and where the French resistance might have been expected to be most stubborn.

The battle in the new area may now be considered as having definitely entered its critical stage, as in the Somme, Flanders and Aisne combats the third and fourth days of the offensive were the most decisive of the campaign. It now seems certain that the present German operation constitutes a very serious blow at the allied lines from the Oise to the Marne, as well as the French front at Montdidier.

FIGHT WAY INTO FRENCH CONFIDENCE

Marines on Field of Marne Demonstrate Americans' Fighting Qualities.

(By Newton C. Parke, International News Service Staff Correspondent.) With the American Army in France, June 10.—The American army has fought its way into the confidence of the French.

Adding to the fierceness of the fighting is the fact that artillery is being used in great numbers by both contending armies. The French gunners, reports agree, have reaped a heavy harvest of the enemy's guns.
