GEN. PERSHING WRITES LETTER TO CLEMENCEAU
Conveys Appreciation to French Premier of Honors Recently Bestowed.

Paris, Aug. 6.—Gen. John J. Pershing has acknowledged in a letter to Premier Clemenceau the honor accorded the general in the recent award to him of the Grand Cross of Legion of Honor by the French government, referring to the letter in which the premier informed Gen. Pershing of the award, in which it was set forth that the French government desired to recognize the eminent qualities the general has displayed and the remarkable services rendered by him "in organizing so promptly and efficiently the American forces in France," Gen. Pershing says:

"Dear Minister-President: Permit me in reply to your message to say that I am profoundly touched by the high distinction the French government has conferred in according me the Grand Cross of the Legion of Honor. I accept this honor with a feeling of deep gratitude and as a tribute paid by the French government to the qualities of the American soldier. They are qualities possessed to an eminent degree by their French comrades.

"In the name of the troops which I have the privilege to command and my own name, I thank you."

ILL-FEELING BETWEEN PRINCES HAD ITS EFFECT
Emperor Assented Reluctantly to Attack Between Soissons and Rheims.

(Associated Press.)
Paris, Aug. 6.—Ill-feeling between the German crown prince and Crown Prince Rupprecht had its effect on the German high command in beginning the present offensive between Soissons and Rheims which has turned into a defeat for the armies commanded by the heir to the Prussian throne.

The German crown prince, according to reports, strongly desired that his armies should have the honor of striking the first blow in the offensive of 1918. The emperor is believed to have lent a favorable ear to the wishes of his son and early indications were that the German crown prince would have another chance to redeem his great failure at Verdun.

Crown Prince Rupprecht of Bavaria, whose command is on the northern end of the battle line, however, laid his case directly before the high command instead of before the emperor. As a military proposition it was the view of Gen. Ludendorff and his associates that the blow should be struck northward without taking into account the personal issue between the two crown princes the high command decided to attack in the north. The emperor is said to have assented rather reluctantly. Decision having been made, the big offensive opened in the north in March and was given a double check—first east of Amiens and second east of Hazebrouck. This failure gave the German crown prince strong support for his plan that the drive should be made against the French lines and apparently the high command gave its consent.

On May 27 the German crown prince struck against the Chemin-des-Dames and was not halted until the Malme was reached. His next effort to reach Paris by way of the Montfidiere-Noyon front was stopped short. His latest effort, begun on July 15, was stopped after three days.
