

PRESIDENT WORKS FOR WOMAN SUFFRAGE

QUIETLY UNDERTAKES TO MUSTER DEMOCRATS.

Senate Begins Final Consideration of Susan B. Anthony Amendment.

Washington, Sept. 25.—(I. N. S.)—President Wilson, since coming out for woman suffrage as a war measure on June 13, has worked quietly but actively among democratic senators in an attempt to muster the necessary votes to pass it.

So far as is known the president has been unable to turn a single vote, but suffragists believe he has succeeded in getting the promises of several southern senators, who could not well vote for the measure, to stay away from the capitol while the vote is taken.

The long campaign for nation-wide woman suffrage, through an amendment to the federal constitution, approached its climax today when the senate began its final consideration of the Susan B. Anthony amendment.

All predictions today were that the amendment would pass, but it was recognized by close observers that there are many chances for a slip-up.

A last minute poll showed that the suffragists were not absolutely certain of the votes necessary for passage.

Interest for the last few days has centered in the votes of three new senators, appointed during the present session to fill vacancies caused by deaths.

J., Sept. 25.—United States Senator Wesley Jones, of Washington, who introduced the resolution in the senate for the investigation of the transaction between the United States Brewers' association and Arthur Brisbane for the purchase of the Washington Times, addressed a mass meeting at the Broad Street theater, warning the nomination at Tuesday's primaries of the republican-prohibition assembly ticket in Essex county.

"Not very much attention has been paid to the second part of the resolution. In my judgment, when it is carried out the testimony of Mr. Palmer will sink into insignificance."



Most Awful Figure in Bolshevik Terrorism is One Peters, Who Has Lived Long in England—Signs Warrants With Animal-Like Fury.

World.)—The most awful figure of the Russian red terror, the man with the most murder on his soul is the present extraordinary commissioner against the counter revolution and sabotage, a dapper little blond Lett named Peters, who has lived in England so long that he speaks Russian with an English accent.

Fierce Hater of Classes. He was known and liked by most of the American correspondents and writers who have been in Russia under the bolsheviki because he seemed more cultivated than the rest.

Let any one be declared a counter revolutionary by a member of the soviet, however, and Peters orders him shot, often without sending him before that other fanatic, Krylenko, president of the revolutionary tribunal.

WILL CARRY CASE TO U. S. SUPREME COURT

Counsel for Cities Service Corporation in New York Confering With Representatives.

Knoxville, Sept. 25.—The Cities Service Corporation will likely carry its case seeking an increase in gas rates here to the United States supreme court.

The opinion of Judge John E. McCall, of Memphis, which was delivered to Judge E. T. Sanford, who disqualified himself owing to previous connection with the case, virtually dismisses the case in the district federal court.

Judge McCall in his opinion admits that the gas rates are low, but states that the city has a right to prescribe the maximum rates, these rights being given by the state in the franchise which permits the city to prescribe the terms under which a company may use the streets of the city.

The ordinance of which complaint is made are neither violations of the constitution of the United States nor the state constitution.

The ordinance of Sept. 8, 1902, as amended by ordinance of Sept. 25, 1907, conditionally granting the gas company a franchise under certain terms, when accepted by the gas company in writing, constituted a valid contract between the city and the company.


