

GERMANY CANNOT CAMOUFLAGE HIS REPLY EVIDENCE TENDS TO SHOW EMPIRE'S PURPOSE.

Officials Expect President to Demolish Teutonic Peace in Message.

(By John Edwin Nevins.) Washington, Oct. 12.—(U. N. S.)—Germany cannot inject any diplomatic complications into the war situation.

The renewed sinkings reported—the wanton murder of the survivors of the American steamer Ticonderoga, drowning of additional wounded children through the torpedoing without warning of the Hirono Maru, the loss of many American boys soldiers on the ill-fated Otranto, which, although not torpedoed, fell victim to collision with a submarine without lights—have renewed the bitter feeling against the Huns everywhere in Washington.

Officials were watching developments in the Turkish situation with such interest today. The state department has not received any communication from the Ottoman government despite reports from various sources that one has been sent.
