MID-EUROPEAN UNION

Small Nations' Future is Theme of Conference.

Philadelphia, Oct. 23.—In historic independence hall there began yesterday a conference which is expected to result in the complete organization of the mid-European union of small nations and the formation of a declaration of independence that will break the yoke of German and Austrian oppression.

Fifteen delegates, unofficially representing about 65,000,000 people of small nations, were present when Mayor Thomas P. Smith welcomed them. After the greeting, the delegates reverently marched past the forefathers of the American republic signed the Declaration of Independence and began their deliberations.

PRESIDENT INDORSSES

Candidacy of George M. Lamont and Charles O. Hennrich for senator in Washington, Oct. 23.—President Wilson has endorsed the candidacies of George M. Lamont and Charles O. Hennrich, seeking a re-election to the United States senate from New Jersey. In a letter to the former the president says: "The people of New Jersey would be served by both of you in the highest way in the councils of the nation."

RESTRICTIONS ON FURNITURE

Washington, Oct. 23.—Restrictions on the manufacture of furniture, eliminating all new patterns for the duration of the war and curtailing active patterns 50 per cent, were announced last night by the war industries board.

OVATION FOR POINCARÉ

Paris, Oct. 23.—(Havas.)—President Poincaré, accompanied by senators, deputies and other officials, visited the Tuileries on Tuesday in an enthusiastic ovation. In reply to the address of welcome, the president said: "The hour of defeat for the enemy is at hand. The party then went to Roubaix, where there are many persons from Alsace and Lorraine. During an address there, M. Poincaré said that no peace was possible without the return of Alsace and Lorraine to France. At the end of the president's trip the party also visited Turcoing, La Bassée and Lens.

JEWELLED CANE FOR FOCH

FAVORITE TARGETS

Letter From France Tells of Attacks on Tennessee Ambulance Corps. On Tennessee, Oct. 24.—(Special.)—Ambulances in the University of Tennessee Ambulance Corps in France have been favorite targets of the Hun's bullets, according to a letter which Private V. L. Jenkins has written to his father, 401 Walnut street. Private Jenkins also enclosed a copy of a letter the German sent to him which the Hun was directed to kill stretcher bearers.

There is no doubt in the mind of the boche as to the identity of his intended victims is conclusively proven by the persistence with which he pursued his inhuman attacks upon armed forces, following ambulances transporting wounded and raking them with machine gun fire.

The attacks upon the ambulances of the ambulance corps indicate the inherent bestial qualities of the descendants of the infamous Attila. While returning from a post with three wounded men in his ambulance, Private Schaeffer was chased more than a kilometer by a boche plane. The road was through an open field, which was also under the fire of enemy artillery. The car was easily discernible from the air, and this did not stop the typical German "ace" from firing his machine gun incessantly at the car, scoring three hits in the rear of the ambulance of the University of Tennessee Ambulance Corps were targets for the German aviators the following evening, when a boche plane, an airplane and a biplane, on the road and dropped bombs on the ambulance. Three fell in close proximity of the "mercy wagons."

Private Wooten, of the same unit, had a hair-breadth escape when a large shell fell six feet in the rear of his ambulance. The car was pierced with bullets. Another member, Private Sprayberry, had a similar experience when a shell directed at the ambulance, on an exposed road, burst so near the car that the shell further wounded the "bliss" he was carrying to the hospital. The ambulance of Private Jenkins proved to be another boche target. Three men, stretcher-bearers, were killed when a shell landed in front of his ambulance, near the dressing station.

FIFTY SOLDIERS INJURED

Troop Train En Route to Port of Embarkation Wrecked Near Gova, Ill. Chicago, Oct. 23.—Approximately fifty soldiers, members of the Eighth United States Infantry, are suffering today from injuries received when a Chicago & Northwestern train of military cars, which was transporting them to an Atlantic seaport port, tipped over, three miles west of Gova, Ill.

The accident was attributed to a split rail. The train was going at the rate of fifty miles an hour to make up lost time, and the engine and first three cars passed the split in safety. The next nine cars were hurled from the track while the last car escaped. Among the injured soldiers, who were en route from Camp Fremont, Cal., who were taken to the Colonial hospital in Clarence Roney, Charleston, Miss.

Most of the soldiers are from western cities. Difficulty in ascertaining all the facts was experienced, due to the confusion thrown around the wreck by the troops, who immediately took charge. It is feared two of the soldiers may die from their injuries.

CAPTURE 15-INCH CANNON

Gun Used in Bombardment of Dunkirk London, Monday, Oct. 21.—Allied forces which have swept the Germans out of Belgium Flanders captured the big fifteen-inch cannon with which the Germans have been bombarding Dunkirk during the past year. The gun was undamaged, according to an official statement issued at the war office.

The group of armies commanded by the King of Belgium has maintained its pressure along the whole front. In their hurried retreat before the Belgian army, the Germans were forced to abandon all their coast defense guns, of which a number were intact.

HINDENBURG FOR PEACE

23.—(A. P.)—Field Marshal Von Hindenburg in an order to German officers in the field referring to negotiations for an armistice declared he approves the peace moves and is obliged to support the government. He asks that the confidence reposed in him by the army be not broken. The German crown prince in an order to a group of armies under his command reminds the officers of the responsibility which they lose a position or modify the line in any way without orders. Copies of these documents have fallen into the hands of the French. "Political events of the past few days," says Von Hindenburg, "have produced the most profound impression upon the army upon the officers. It is my duty to support the government instituted by his majesty. I approve the steps taken toward peace. The German army has a superiority over all others in that the troops and officers have never engaged in politics. We fire at those that principle. I expect that the confidence that was accorded me in the days of success will be all the stronger now."
