PRIVATE OWNERSHIP

Dictation of Financial Power

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The commission believes the time is ripe to recommend concrete legislation for the regulation of the railroads. It says that the nation's decision should be made in ordinary times, limitation of railway construction to the development of inland waterways, and their co-ordination with railroads.

In other words, the commission is opposed to restoration of the old conditions of individual ownership in which the building of new lines without proof to the government that they are economically necessary.

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PANKHURST AMONG WOMEN NOMINATED

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Mrs. Frederick S. Pathick Lawrence first came into prominence in London in 1912, when she was arrested on a charge of conspiring to incite riots by suffragettes. Sentenced to nine months' imprisonment, she started a hunger strike in prison. Her sentence was modified and she was released on her promise to abandon militant tactics.

MISSING MINESWEEPERS

Coast Guard Crews Search in Face of Blizzard.

Calumet, Mich., Dec. 5.—(I. N. S.)—In the face of a blizzard a search for missing minesweepers began today in the vicinity of Keweenaw point for two missing minesweepers which left Fort Wilcox Nov. 23 for the Atlantic coast. Two tugs from Fort Arthur reported they had failed to find any wreckage. The Eagle Harbor crew and the Portage Lake coast crew, which is searching the west shore, were then ordered out.

TO MAINTAIN POSITION

England's Envoy Wants No Restrictions on Her Sea Superiority.

London, Dec. 5.—(I. N. S.)—Great Britain's ambassador will, it is believed, insist on no restrictions which will prevent the English navy from maintaining superiority in the North Sea. Winston Churchill, former first lord of the admiralty, declared in a campaign speech at London.

There will be absolute determination that no limitation shall be placed upon the right of England to maintain her naval defense, added Col. Churchill. Col. Churchill is now minister of munitions.
