GRAND MILITARY REVIEW

Christmas Dinner at Field Headquarters—Aviators Plan Stunts.

General Headquarters of the American Expeditionary Forces in France, Chaumont, Dec. 22, 6 p.m.—(I. N. S.)—Preparations for President Wilson's Christmas visit to Gen. Pershing's headquarters and the review of American troops were in full swing here today.

The mayor of Chaumont ordered the town decorated and already the Stars and Stripes and the French tricolor are blossoming forth on every hand.

Gen. Pershing and his staff, the mayor, the French general commanding the district and other officials will meet the presidential party at the railway station at 9 o'clock on Wednesday morning.

The review of 10,000 troops will commence about 10:30 o'clock, and if the weather permits the American aviators plan some sensational stunts.

EFFORTS TO UNLOAD NEW PROBLEMS OF PRESIDENT

Pro-German Propagandists Working to Create Differences Among Envoys—Embassy Suggestion Raised Regarding the Formation of the League of Nations.

Paris, Dec. 23.—(I. N. S.)—Various developments in the international situation are causing embarrassment to President Wilson and the other members of the American peace mission.

It is plain that pro-German propagandists, working from Scandinavian points, are attempting to create points of difference between the American envoys and the European representatives of the allies' wants.

The new and embarrassing suggestions which are being raised form the chief reason for the president's insistence on the formation of a league of nations.

President Wilson's influence is increasing as a result of his personal contact with various international leaders, and the relations existing between the American executive and French statesmen are extremely cordial.

It is hoped that a similar consequence will follow the trip of Mr. Wilson to London this week.

At the same time, however, it is made plain that if such influence is carried out too far, the result might be the involving of America in an entangling European alliance.



TRANSPORT CARRYING 3,000 LEFT FRANCE DEC. 13; TWO OTHERS IN PORT

Washington, Dec. 23.—Sailing from France of the transport Rijndam Dec. 19 with about 8,000 officers and men was announced today by the war department. The vessel will probably dock at Newport News Jan. 1.

On board are casual companies 111 and 404, Thirty-second brigade headquarters, coast artillery corps; Thirteenth anti-aircraft section, Fifth anti-aircraft section; 114th ammunition train, thirty-one casual officers, including Brig.-Gen. Charles Zimmerman.

The United States transport Cedric arrived in port today from Liverpool carrying American troops.

The Cedric was followed into port by the transport George Washington, the ship that conveyed President Wilson to France, also bringing home 4,000 American soldiers.

The units on board are the 137th field artillery, advanced school detachment of the Eleventh division and the chemical warfare service detachment No. 1. There are also 968 wounded and sick soldiers and twenty civilians.
