

**THE PLATFORM.**

The Democratic-Conservative party of the parish of Natchitoches, in Convention assembled, pronounce the following to be the issues in this campaign, to the fulfillment of which we pledge our people if called to power.

1st. The election to, and qualification in office of, capable, competent and honest citizens, thoroughly identified with the material interests of our parish.

2d. A reduction of the expenses of the parish to less than one-half of its present parish taxes; and to that end we demand the reduction of fees and salaries of officers to the standard of a fair remuneration.

3d. A maintenance and fostering of a rigorous PUBLIC SCHOOL system for the benefit and education of all the children of the parish, both white and black.

4th. The full recognition of the rights of all men, without regard to race, color or previous condition, before the law.

5th. The enactment and enforcement of a wise code of laws, to protect all laboring men in their rights, and at the same time to protect and encourage the capital invested in our parish.

6th. We pledge ourselves that not one dollar of taxes shall be levied to pay past obligations of our parish, for the reason that the law requires that provision to pay, and appropriation for expenses, shall go hand in hand.

Such equal and just claims as are due by the parish, shall be paid from the collection of taxes that are already levied in accordance with law, and due and collectible.

All monies issued in excess of appropriations, and for fraudulent purposes, we condemn as null and void, and we demand of our elected officials their repudiation in toto; and we further pledge ourselves, that legal steps shall be taken to recover to the parish Treasury all fraudulent claims of whatsoever character, which have been paid by Radical or other officials to any person or persons whatsoever.

We arraign the Radical Republican leaders of this parish, and indict them in the bar of public opinion on the following counts:

1st. For the election and elevation to official position in our parish, in almost every instance, of men totally disqualified, by reason of their ignorance, or known corruption.

2d. We charge them with having disgraced the bench of our Judicial District, by the elevation thereto of a man who was, and is a speculator in the funds of the State and parish, and the owner and instigator of jobbery and rings, for the plunder of the Treasury, and the impoverishment of the people, as witness the "map contract," the "bridge contract," the "paper list ring," and the "immigration bureau scheme."

We charge them with degrading our parish Judicial bench by fastidious upon the people Parish Judges ignorant of law, devoid of personal character, venal and corrupt; one of whom, public opinion and an outraged community forced from the bench for incompetency, and his known affiliation and connection with rings and jobbers, and another stands indicted before the Courts by a competent Grand Jury, for embezzlement.

We charge them with appointing and confirming to position, a Tax Collector who, with a venal, incompetent and villainous Police Jury, also of their party, plundered the people and the Treasury of untold thousands—perjured himself in the settlement of his accounts—heaped upon us taxation at the rate of eight per cent, and left us a debt to pay equal in amount to one-ninth of the total value of property in the parish.

We charge them with the plundering of the School Treasury, through their Judge, Senator, and Representatives, of thousands of dollars, thereby depriving our children and those of our colored fellow-citizens of the benefit of education, a crime that an outraged community cannot too severely condemn or punish.

We denounce them for having given us Magistrates whose duty it was to protect the citizen, suppress crime and vindicate the law, but who have been indicted or convicted for murder, theft, or perjury.

The Republican party of the parish of Natchitoches, composed of the most ignorant, deluded and corrupt body of men known to our State or the South, have, by a systematic plundering rule, reduced the valuation of real and personal property in nine years—four million and thirteen thousand dollars levied and collected from a people impoverished by war and overtaxation, three hundred and twenty-three thousand two hundred and ninety-three dollars and six cents, or one-third of the entire present valuation of property, both real and personal, in 1875 since 1867—have based upon us in that time a debt of over one hundred thousand dollars have arrayed the colored race against the whites—have plunged troops into our midst, arrested and fined innocent citizens without warrant of law.

We charge the Republican party as being responsible for all the crime committed in our parish, by reason of the insufficiency, incompetency and venality of their officials, and we denounce their government of the parish and State as corrupt and infamous, and not deserving the support and confidence of a single virtuous citizen in our community.

We discountenance all disturbances of the peace of the parish, and denounce all instigators thereof.

We demand, and will enforce Registration, a fair election and a fair count—and to that end will hold personally responsible to the people of our parish, those who control the election and registration machinery.

Our object is reform, retrenchment and relief; that by honest and economy, we may reduce taxation and lighten the burdens of the people, and to that end we call upon all patriotic sons of Natchitoches, without regard to race, color, or previous condition, to join us.

We ask but a trial of committing the State and parish to our keeping, and if good Government, security, protection, and prosperity do not dawn on an overtaxed, depopulated and disheartened people, then drive us from power with scorn and indignation.

Upon the paramount issues herein connected, we cordially invite the co-operation of every Democrat and Republican, who is earnest and willing in this crisis of our State, to unite with us in the great work of reform.

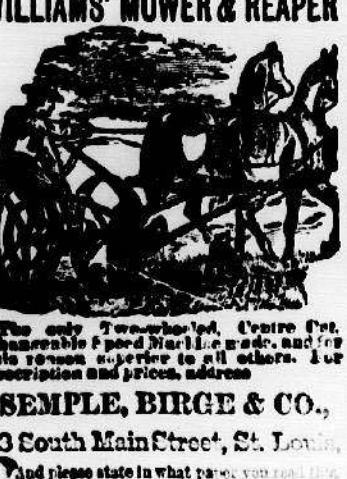

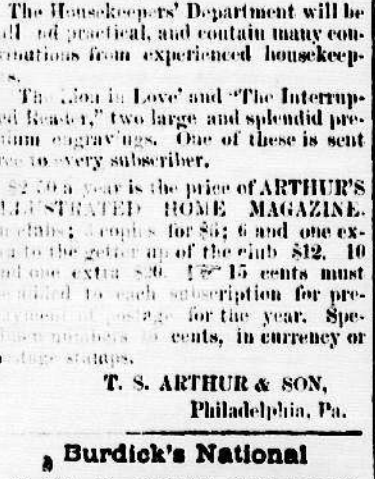
