

HAZEN AND GARLINGTON.

What is the Responsibility for the Failure of the Proteus Expedition?
Mr. Hazen, Kent, counsel for Lieutenant Garlington before the Proteus court of inquiry, has written the following letter to General W. B. Bacon, Chief Signal Officer, Washington, July 22, 1884.

General W. B. Bacon:
Dear Sir,--My professional relation to Lieutenant Garlington in the late investigation of the failure of the Proteus expedition under his command, and for a while the occasion for this letter, His honor and your published comments on his failure to leave more stores at Cape Sabine, are great to me, and I must assume it to be your duty to fix the responsibility for the loss of the Proteus.

The world now knows that the fate of the Proteus was due to the failure to deposit a proper quantity of stores at Cape Sabine. The stores which Lieutenant Garlington left at Cape Sabine were in accordance with Lieutenant Greely's instructions. It is true that the stores had been left more freely than would have been saved. The legitimate inference from this is that, while the few stores left at Cape Sabine were in accordance with Greely's instructions, the loss of the others was due to his failure to leave a larger supply.

Under your sole direction the relief expedition of 1857 was sent north in the Proteus, under the command of Lieutenant Garlington, and arrived at Cape Sabine on the 22d of July, 1857. It had had no orders, or any permission, to leave supplies at Cape Sabine, and the court of inquiry found that under your instructions he had neither, and justified his course in not doing so. You are now asking me to permit Lieutenant Garlington to deposit any of his stores in the northward course of the Proteus, and I am, in your view, to be held responsible for the failure of the Proteus.
