CITY AND SUBURBAN. THE COLD-WAVE FLAG. Meeting of the Chamber of Commerce Yesterday—Lecture on this Subject.

The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Directors of the Chamber of Commerce was held yesterday evening.

Present: R. E. Blankenship (president), George A. Ainslie (first vice-president), and James H. Blair, Robert S. Boshier, and Henry Bodeker, W. M. Archer, J. H. Whitty, and Frank E. Patrick.

The secretary had before the Board communications from Collector O. H. Russell and C. S. Fairchild, Assistant Secretary of the Treasury.

The Board had asked Mr. Russell to allow the cold-wave flag, that has been arranged for to be displayed from the custom-house.

The secretary was directed to correspond with the Secretary of War with the view of accomplishing the object aimed at.

The Committee on Inland Trade reported that they had communicated with the railroad companies as to transmitting by telegraph the cold-wave signals over their lines.

After discussing a number of other matters the Board adjourned.
