The Senate Tariff Bill—Again. Recurring to the speech commented upon in this column yesterday—namely, that made by Mr. Voorhees last Monday on the Senate tariff bill—we will add that the Senator from Indiana seemed to be terrified in his speech.

Another thing these statistics disclose, and that is that there is an enormous amount of property in this country—real and personal—while other escapes taxation altogether or is assessed far below its true value.

When the United States entered the world to celebrate the centennial of Washington at Philadelphia in 1876, the result was as astonishing to them as the exhibition of 1853 had been to England.

Such being the nature of the Senate bill to reform the tariff, there is nothing for the Democrats of the two houses here to do except to enact that bill into a law.

The bill needed by the country and by the Democratic party now claims the action of Congress. "Action?" "Action?" "Action!" is what the people demand.

According to a census bulletin, prepared by Mr. J. K. Upton, special agent of the Eleventh Census, and which has just been published, "the total true valuation" of the real and personal property in the country at the close of the census period 1880 amounted to \$65,671,017, of which amount \$24,544,332 represents the value of real estate and improvements thereon, and \$41,126,685 that of personal property, including railroads, mines, and quarries.

The true valuation, it is explained, is what would be deemed a fair selling price for the property, and is thus termed in distinction from the assessed valuation, "which is a value placed upon certain taxable property for taxation purposes only."

The true value of personal property in most cases is that placed upon it by its owners and given to the enumerators and other census officials, as required by law.

The Bedford Index says that Mr. Goode is averse to having his name presented to the congressional nominating convention, should "Bedford, his native and resident county, to which he is greatly attached, have the honor of electing him to the past, present another son to the convention for this honor."

Popular petitions are being sent to the Supreme Court of South Carolina, asking for a prompt decision of the case now before that body involving the constitutionality of the dispensary law. The case was argued three months ago.

The Philadelphia Common Council, by a unanimous vote, has declared that to sell the gas-works would be against the best interests of the city, and placed itself on record as being opposed to any scheme that any individual or any corporation

may have for getting possession of the plant and franchise. This action was precipitated by the project which J. Edward Addicks is said to have formed to buy the gas-works for \$20,000,000.

Our Next Nominee for President. The Washington Post learns from a gentleman who has travelled extensively through the South that everywhere Mr. Stevenson is the favorite of the people to succeed Mr. Cleveland in the presidential chair.

Certainly our Vice-President is a popular man; but southern folks are thinking ten times more about business affairs than they are about politics. Above all other things they would like to see prompt action taken on the tariff bill.

We know that the presidential nomination is more than two years off, but we feel justified in encouraging Mr. Stevenson to this extent.

We have been presented by a citizen of Stuart with several specimens of a curious little stone found only in Patrick, and pronounced by leading geologists to be the oldest known in the mineral world. These stones make very pretty neck-pieces, or charms for watch-chains—Danville Herald.

Mrs. Cornelia Frances Coster, who died last Sunday at the Hotel Savoy, in New York, left a will directing that her entire fortune of \$1,000,000 be devoted to building a manumission in Washington territory. Her instructions are carried out, and the fund will be perpetuated in the country.

A decree for the foreclosure of the East Tennessee, Virginia and Georgia railroad in the action on the mortgage against the equity of the Richmond Trust and Loan Association plan has been entered in Knoxville, Tenn.

The decree for the foreclosure of the Richmond and Danville road is expected on or before April 10th. This latter is the last of the foreclosures suits under the reorganization.

Inquiry is made as to what the marching hosts of Coxey & Co. are moving on Washington for. The ostensible object, we believe, was to impress Congress by a great demonstration with the necessity for appropriating several hundred millions of money to internal improvements in order to furnish occupation for the unemployed.

Great Quantities of Chesapeake Fish. Fishermen in the Chesapeake waters, says the Baltimore Sun, are reaping a harvest just now. Yesterday's steamer brought to market great quantities of fish, including blue crabs, and they brought unusually good prices.
