JOINT PREPARATIONS FOR ST. PATRICK'S-DAY.

A Banquet Probable—Religious Meetings—Many Persons Converted—To Be Appointed Letter-Carrier—The Case of Jones—Personal.

PETERSBURG, VA., February 22.—(Special.)—Mrs. Maggie D. Bourdon, wife of Mr. Branch Bourdon, died at her home, on Old street, at a late hour last night, of consumption. She was very young, and had only been married about five months.

Mr. D. S. Lanier, an elderly and well-known farmer of Dinwiddie county, died on Saturday at his home, near Reams Station.

Mr. W. A. Wilkerson, one of the best-known citizens of Mattocks, died this morning at his home, in that village.

GENERAL NEWS.

At a joint meeting of the Catholic Knights of America and St. Patrick's Beneficial Society, held yesterday, a committee was appointed to consist of the members of St. Patrick's-Day, March 17th. It is probable that a banquet will be decided upon.

Since the 2d of January there have been over one hundred conversions in the West-Street Methodist Episcopal church, of which Rev. Mr. Sewell is the pastor. The interest in these revival meetings continues to such an extent that the church is crowded nightly, and Mr. Sewell declares that he will continue them just as long as this interest lasts.

The same interest is manifested in the meetings of the West-End Baptist church, where some seventy-five or more professions of faith have been made, and where the pastor, Rev. W. S. Leake, preaches nightly to large congregations.

It is understood that William T. Crowder (colored) will be appointed a letter-carrier, to fill the vacancy in the post-office caused by the retirement of Mr. Charles W. Jones. This appointment, of course, is made under the civil-service regulations.

THE ARREST OF JONES.

The United States statute under which Mr. Charles W. Jones, for some years past a trusted letter-carrier, was arrested, and will be prosecuted, is that which empowers the postmaster to arrest any person entering into his possession, and which imposes a penalty of from one to five years' imprisonment at hard labor.

A great deal of sympathy is felt here, both by Mr. Jones and his family, who stand with the community; and our people will watch the trial of the case with much interest.

At a late hour last night, while Mr. Leonard Jamison, a young man, was passing along Low street, he was assaulted and badly hurt by two negroes, without cause, as he alleges. His worst wound is on the head, where he meeting a violent blow with a beer-bottle by one of his assailants. This morning the police arrested and jailed Charles Robinson and James Scott (colored), who read the Dispatch's report to the Times.

The exposure has created a great sensation here, especially among the colored people, who have no other place for the burial of their dead.

Farmer claims to have shipped only eleven bodies, but the extent of his operations cannot be ascertained until the graves are reopened. Farmer was appointed sexton last July. He was formerly a letter-carrier.

He is a veteran Democrat, true as the needle to the pole, and worthy of any honor the Democrats of the State could confer upon him.
