THE OBSTINACY TO BE SIMPLE. The Battalion to Attend Special Services at St. Paul's Church To-Night and Hold Informal Reception To-Morrow After Oakwood Exercises.

The Richmond Light Infantry Blues will celebrate the 10th anniversary of their organization to-day and to-morrow. There will be a church parade to-night and the battalion will attend special services at St. Paul's church, at which a sermon will be preached by Rev. Dr. Carmichael, their chaplain.

THEIR FIRST CELEBRATION. The first detailed report on record of the celebration of the anniversary of the Blues is that of May 10, 1887, when the company was sixty-one years old.
