RUSH TO VOLUNTEER.

VIRGINIANS BECOMING EAGER TO DON THEIR UNIFORMS. MANY COMPANIES ARE NOW FULL. State's Entire Quota Will Soon Be Ready—Will Have to Wait for the Camp Equipage—Troops Anxious to Come—The Board of Surgeons.

Virginians are volunteering rapidly for service wherever they may be ordered. Some of the companies report to the Adjutant-General that they are already recruited up to the maximum, one or two having enrolled above this number in order to have enough after the medical examiner has passed upon the fitness of the men composing the organizations.

Several companies have signified their desire to be ordered into camp at once, as they have been recruited to their maximum strength, but they cannot be ordered here until the necessary camp equipage is received from the government.

General Tyler and Adjutant-General Nalle were not worked as hard yesterday as for several days past, owing to all arrangements for mobilization of troops until the actual order for them to begin moving is given having been completed.

FOR MEDICAL EXAMINERS. Governor Tyler yesterday recommended to the Secretary of War Dr. Charles V. Carleton of this city, and Dr. W. S. Sayers of Norfolk, as members of the Board of Surgeons to examine the men who desire to enlist in the volunteer army from Virginia.

HOSPITAL TENDERED. The faculty of the Medical College of Virginia has tendered to the Governor the free use of the Dominion Hospital for its staff of physicians and trained nurses for the care of sick and disabled soldiers.

THE HOTELS AT OLD POINT. The somewhat prevalent idea that the hotels at Old Point are closed by the government is pronounced absurd. There are also current reports that no trolley-cars are allowed to run to Old Point or to leave there after 9 o'clock at night, and that all the guests at the hotels have to be inside by the same hour.




